Feedback from Darrin Sore, our PCSO Many of you will know Darrin was outside looking at parking earlier this week. He has asked me to give parents some feedback/reminders:

- **A disabled space is solely for the use of a vehicle displaying a Blue Badge**

I spoke with a parent who does have a disabled badge; he told me he is frequently unable to access the space as it is used by parents as an ordinary parking space. Please don't. Access by a disabled driver may be needed at any time.

- **No vehicle should wait or park on the yellow zig zag lines outside the school**

The zig zag road markings are placed there to advise motorists not to wait or park on these lines **for the safety of the children** and although the local council do not have the powers to enforce penalties, police frequently issue tickets in such cases. Tickets are issued on the grounds of causing an obstruction to either other motorists or pedestrians and not for parking on the yellow zig zag lines directly.

I would ask parents to show consideration for others and to consider parking further along the lane or responsibly elsewhere in the village. The safety of the children is paramount.

Food Hygiene Rating - It's a '5'!

Following an unannounced inspection by the Foods Standards Agency, our school kitchen was awarded a '5', the highest possible food hygiene rating. We were delighted, but not surprised, given Clive's hard work and pride in his kitchen. Our congratulations go to Clive, and Stephen his mentee, on their achievement.

Health Issues We have had a case of Hand, Foot and Mouth reported. This is a viral infection that can affect young children and the symptoms include a fever, mouth ulcers and development of a rash.
