December in School

Puffins In puffin class we have been learning about the traditions of Christmas through making Santa faces, repeating pattern painted Christmas lights, salt dough decorations and Christmas cards. We have looked at different counties and explored what they do for Christmas as it is different from our traditions. The children have been practising for their performance on Friday and have learned lots of songs. We have also chosen our new topic for next half term, which is Under the Sea. We have been watching a few clips about fish and the children have gotten very excited about it.

Owls This month the Owls have been expressing their creativity and developing their senses as they have created their own invention stories based on our class text - The Magic Porridge Pot. The Owls took their knowledge of inventions through their study of Louis Braille, and developed their own inventions that might help other people (like the giant teeth brushing machine).. or just be extremely cool (like a pool that floats through outer space). We then used our inventions to come back to fictional story writing to develop a story with a beginning (showing who, what, when, where, and why), a middle (building up and describing a problem within the story), and an ending (during which the problem is solved and a resolution found). In Maths, we have been looking at equal groups - and exploring the different ways that we can represent equal groups of objects and pictures by organising them into arrays. In addition to the excitement of our holiday extravaganzas, we held a wedding at Saint Walston Church to enhance our study of belonging within the religion of Christianity. During our science lessons, our Owls have been immersing themselves in all things animals, looking at different types of animal classifications that can be found living on land, under the sea, and up in the air. A well-earned holiday should be enjoyed by all!

Eagles In Eagles we have been working hard on our Christmas song - Hark the Herald Angels sing. The pupils have put in a tremendous effort and have come a long way with their singing. We continue to work hard on our calculation methods and mental fluency in mathematics. In Literacy, the children have been working so hard to meet specific targets and objectives in their creative writing. The children also showed great diligence and tenacity in their recent series of tests. Finally, I would like to thank Eagles for continuing to come into school with real enthusiasm, despite some fun but tiring events that we have recently attended.

Flamingos have worked incredibly hard this last half term. They have enjoyed thinking about their stories based on 'The Magic Porridge Pot' and we have had some wonderful inventive results! One story had a magic pot that whizzed us away with a jet pack! The words, 'fly pot, fly!' made us all smile. Maths lessons have seen the children busy making links across the different areas and resilience has developed alongside their ever growing enthusiasm for their endeavours. In science the children have been investigating different animals recapping on habitats and then identifying different groups, particularly mammals. Music lessons have rung with seasonal good cheer and our classroom has truly been a happy, seasonal place to work in. Well done Flamingos. Toucans Beyond our fraction work and news writing, Toucans have done a bit of time travelling. In History, they have been looking at what children did at playtime in the 1950s. The class got a chance to play hopscotch and throwing discs closest to the wall. We also had fun playing skipping and chanting games, (something of a lost art!) where the children used a large rope and saw how many could skip and chant at the same time. It was excellent to see how much enjoyment they got from something that wasn't electronic and needed a screen. I wonder if any will try some of these games this weekend!

Trip to St. Mary and St. Walstan Church On Monday 4th December 2017 year 1 and year2 visited the local church as part of their belonging topic. They took part in a mock wedding. The children took on the roles of a wedding party and dressed up for the occasion in very smart suits and dresses. After the service they celebrated with a three-tier wedding cake and juice.
