This week we have been learning...

Maths:

- We have been learning about how to create number bonds and deepening our understanding of how to combine numbers.
- We have begun to develop a deeper understanding of how numbers are combined when using addition.
- We have continued to work upon writing digits and words up to 20.
- We have developed subitising skills and relating these to numbers.

Literacy:

- We have begun to investigate the story structure of *Funnybones*.
- We have decoded and learnt new vocabulary that links to both *Funnybones* and our topic in science.
- We have written simple predictions based upon the text consolidating and applying the new language taught.
- We got to practice our listening skills at the super, exciting Children's Proms.

Science:

- We have looked at how animal's bodies are similar and different to our own.

History:

- We investigated what it was like to be a nurse when Florence Nightingale helped the soldiers in the Crimean War. We investigated why people are significant in history.
