

<p><u>English</u> This week the children have been identifying the features of non-chronological reports and completing their own research. They have been learning how to use generalisers in their writing and how to use colons, semi-colons and dashes.</p> <p><u>Spellings</u> We will be learning to spell words when the 'c' makes a 's' sound before i, e and y.</p> <p><u>Maths</u> In Maths we have been using a formal method to divide. We now know why the 'bus stop' method is not really a 'bus stop' at all but instead a form of array.</p> <p><u>Topic</u> This week we have been discussing in more detail the digestive system. We have also completed our own research on the Amazon Rainforest,</p>	<p><u>English</u> Next week the children will be writing their non-chronological reports and learning the difference between the passive and active voice.</p> <p><u>Spellings</u> The children will be learning to spell words with unstressed vowels and unstressed consonants.</p> <p><u>Maths</u> We will continue our work on division and progress onto the long method of division.</p> <p><u>Topic</u> The children will be applying the skills they have developed in English over the last couple of weeks in order to complete an engaging recount about our trip to the Natural History Museum. In Geography, the children will be revising the water cycle and locating different rivers in the UK.</p>	<p><u>Homework</u> Please encourage your children to practise their weekly spellings ready for their test on Monday.</p> <p>Children must also continue to read so they can be working towards their targets on Accelerated Reader. The children now know their point targets for Bronze award and some children have already achieved these!</p> <p>As the children will be writing about their trip next week, could you please talk with your children about the things they did and the exhibitions they saw.</p> <p><u>Timestables</u> The curriculum expectation is that children know all the timestables up to 12x12. The children must be fluent with these number facts, therefore can you please ensure the children are rehearsing these at home. The children have set themselves a personal target to work towards in class this week.</p>

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
