

THE FORCE IS STRONG WITH THIS ONE

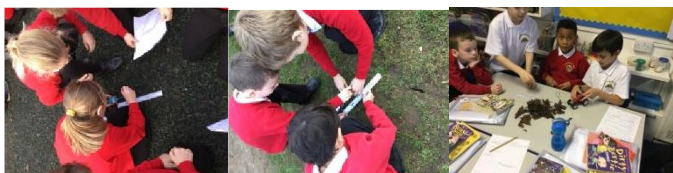
Jackdaw news

As ever, we've returned and hit the ground running. Maths has focused on perimeter and area. Ask your child what the difference is and what rules we use to work out the answer to such questions. In literacy we are exploring two key parts that create interesting sentences: expanded noun phrases and subordinate clauses. We will do this through exploring Ancient Greek mythology. Thanks Jess for your out-of-school research.

Science sees us exploring force and we did a test on push and pull using toy cars, rulers, elastic bands and different surfaces. We also wrote up our first true scientific report using non-fiction organisational features.
