Last week we were learning...

Maths:

We have focused on adding three single digit numbers using ten frames, counters and number lines and using the language of 'first, then, then, now'

Literacy:

We have been learning about imperative verbs and their use in commands and instructions. We started to think about instructions to 'catch an alien'.

Science:

We made rocket mice with different materials to see which was most suitable and why.

History:

We learnt about Katherine Johnson; one of the first black females to work for NASA, she went on to calculate the trajectory to put Neil Armstrong on the moon.



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Next week we will be learning...

Maths: we will be looking at subtraction of single digit numbers

Literacy: We will be writing our instructions on 'how to catch and alien'

Science: we are going to test bottle rockets and make predictions on which will travel the furthest

History: We will be thinking about the footprints on the moon and doing some practical work outside.
