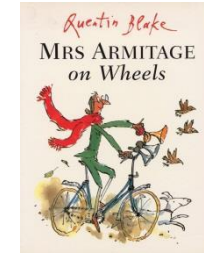

<p>Maths: we have been focussing on place value and partitioning numbers into tens and ones. We have been looking at how we can partition a number into different combinations of tens and ones.</p> <p>Literacy: We have been writing our own versions of Mrs Armitage's Wheels using adjectives to add description and time connectives to help sequence events.</p> <p>Science: We looked at tooth health with Doctor Brushwell and the tooth defenders.</p> <p>History: We found most of the answers to our questions for Amelia Earhart and look at the places she flew, using an Atlas to help plot her route.</p>	<p>Maths: we will be revising efficient methods to help us with addition and subtraction</p> <p>Literacy: We are going to work on our speaking and listening skills; honing our interview technique to question each other on our bicycle inventions and write newspaper reports.</p> <p>Science: We will continue looking at things that are dead, alive, never alive.</p> <p>History: We will be looking at chronology and ordered events that have occurred in our history unit.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Reminders</p> <p><u>Key stage 1 SATS</u></p> <p>There have been some enquiries about which dates the Kingfishers will sit their SATS. We can run the assessments at any point in May. We can spread the papers out over the month if we wish or sit them all in a week. To that end, we decide nearer the time based on how the class are and what else is happening.
