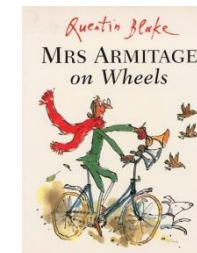
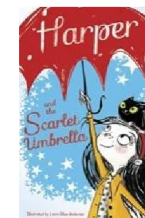

<p>Maths: We continued our work on statistics, collecting our own data and presenting it with tally charts and block diagrams.</p> <p>Literacy: We finished writing our postcards by choosing a friend or family member to write to. We have also been writing questions and using these to help collect data in maths.</p> <p>Science: The Kingfishers tested their senses of taste, smell, touch and sight through practical activities.</p> <p>History: We looked at different historical sources to find out more about the life of Amelia Earhart.
