## Covid Cases week ending 11<sup>th</sup> March 2022

We have had 17 reported positive cases this week across the school.

We now have cases in all classes apart from Flamingos, if you partake in regular LFD testing please do so Monday morning before sending your child in to school.

**Attendance** Letters have now all been sent out to the families where we have a concern around their child's attendance. School attendance is a contentious subject, and I understand that the letters (which were quite formal) may have upset/angered some families. This was

not the intention, however, we are duty bound to share with you your child's attendance and to inform you if their attendance is below a certain threshold and to offer support if you wish to accept it. Sometimes just seeing your child's attendance on paper and their percentage helps you to see visually how much time your child may have missed from school.

We are very grateful to families who have supported us by keeping their child at home if they are unwell and taking them for PCR tests before sending them back to school. This has enabled us to continue to run school as 'normal' and we haven't been as impacted by Covid-19 as other schools (until now!).

Term time holidays, unless in exceptional circumstances, cannot be agreed. I know this is frustrating as holidays are so very expensive during the school holiday dates. Over the last few years we have tried to help, by moving our inset days, so we finish earlier in the July compared to other schools, in the hope that this may help you to book a cheaper holiday. However, in doing this we have to be mindful of the impact on families with children in other schools who have different term dates, essentially we will never get it right and nor can we please everyone!

**Covid-19** Although the national guidance has changed, the advice from Norfolk County Council states that we should now start to treat Covid-19 infections like any other public health concern we face in schools, e.g with chickenpox your child is not allowed into school until the spots are scabbed over, Norovirus/tummy bugs, your child is not allowed back into school until they are 48 hours clear. With Covid-19 infections, your child will need to stay at home and isolate for at least 5 full days and then continue to <u>follow the guidance</u> until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days. If they are still testing positive by day 10 they are allowed back into school on day 11.

'Routine national and local contact tracing will end and reliance will be placed upon positive cases making their relevant contacts aware. Contacts will no longer be required to self-isolate or take daily tests, although while asymptomatic kits are still freely available testing is advisable and guidance to take extra care to keep others safe will remain.'
